Sekolahku Universitiku English Language Programme: Fun with English!

Despite the MCO, a student volunteer team from FLL's English Language Department participated in the Sekolahku Universitiku programme by creating fun English language modules for primary school students. Sekolahku Universitiku is a Ministry of Higher Education effort to develop humanistic graduates through community programmes with schools. In collaboration with UM's Student Affairs Division, the ELD team conducted the English Language Programme for students and teachers of SK Bukit Pantai and SK Kg Selayang. Thirteen undergraduate students led by Adam Hakimi and Nurin Hassan were advised by Dr. Ruth Ong, Dr. Ayeshah Syed, Dr. Chew Shin Yi, Dr. Shangeetha Rajah Kumaran and Dr. Azlin Zainal. Programme preparation and delivery were conducted virtually from June to October 2020. The team created the English is Fun module, comprising a printed book and an accompanying website with language activities for primary school students. The programme began with an online sharing session with the school teachers, in which the teachers responded positively to the materials. The printed modules were then sent to the schools.

10th MELTA International Research Conference in English Language Education (MIRCELE Online 2020)

Three teams from the Faculty of Languages and Linguistics, Universiti Malaya participated in the 10th MELTA International Research Conference in English Language Education online (MIRCELE Online 2020) on the 7th of November 2020. This was the first time the conference was held virtually. Three renowned international speakers were featured during the conference: Prof Dr Low Ee Ling from National Institute of Education, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore; Assoc Prof Dr Troy McConachy from the University of Warwick, United Kingdom; and Assoc Prof Dr Janet Scull from Monash University, Australia.

The three teams competed for the MELTA Excellence in Research awards in the Master's category. Extended abstracts submitted were reviewed by a panel of experts before they were accepted for the conference. The teams won MELTA Excellence in Research Awards:



Team UM emerged winners in the following categories:


1. SoundScape




